A Brief History of SFO's Public Art Collection

The San Francisco Arts Commission (SFAC), a city agency, launched SFO's Public Art Program in 1977 with the construction of Terminal 3. Over the course of the next ten years, it purchased or commissioned over 60 works for Terminals 1, 2 and 3.

Later, the International Terminal, completed in 2000, became home to another 17 major works, commissioned and created specifically for the new facility's state-of-the-art lobbies, corridors and gate rooms.

In 2011, with the renovation of Terminal 2, the Arts Commission debuted five new major installations and re-installed artwork in the airport's collection that was historically sited in the terminal or that was in storage. All of the works in SFO's public art collection were commissioned in accordance with San Francisco's percent for art ordinance, which provides for art enrichment allocation equivalent to 2% percent of the construction cost of a new or renovated civic structure.

About the San Francisco Arts Commission and the Public Art Program


The SFAC is the city agency that champions the arts in San Francisco. We believe that a creative cultural environment is essential to the city's well-being. Established by charter in 1932, the SFAC integrates the arts into all aspects of city life. Programs include: Civic Art Collection, Civic Design Review, Community Arts & Education, Cultural Equity Grants, Public Art, SFAC Galleries and Street Artists Licensing. The agency's core values are committed to the principle that all residents have equal access to arts experiences in all disciplines, that programs are provided comprehensively and evenly throughout the city and that they are innovative and of the highest quality.

The Public Art Program was established with the passage of the Arts Enrichment Ordinance in 1969, one of the first of its kind in the country. The Public Art Program seeks to promote a diverse and stimulating cultural environment. The Program encourages the creative interaction of artists, designers, city staff, officials and community members during the design of city projects in order to develop public art that is specific to the site and meaningful to the community. From the airport to the zoo to neighborhood parks and libraries, the Public Art Program ensures that San Francisco residents, visitors and employees have access to world-class art in everyday settings.

How to Use this Catalogue

This catalogue is organized by terminal. Each artwork is assigned a number, which can easily be identified on the terminal map located at the beginning of each section. The numbers assigned to each object are derived from their accession number, so they do not follow numerical order. Rather, the artworks are presented in the order that travelers might encounter them as they move through the space. Black object numbers mean that the artwork is located on level 2, departure and ticketing. Gray object numbers signify that the objects are located on level 1, arrival and baggage claim. White object numbers refer to level 3, which is the mezzanine.



Fly, Flight, Fugit

"When I'm in a plane," said Squeak Carnwath, "I often think about things that fly naturally. This work is about those things—bees, flags, snow, bugs, mercury, rain, and flights of fancy." Much of Carnwath's work is about her own thoughts, reactions, and memories.

She frequently combines hand-scrawled words, visual images, and rich color into luminous paintings that prompt the personal thoughts and memories of her viewers.

Shining Paths: San Francisco's Sister Cities 2006


This work in its entirety consists of 16 light projections (divided between boarding areas A and G) that celebrate San Francisco's Sister Cities around the world. The work is an extension of the artist's On the Air project, located on the floor of the international terminal arrivals lobby. Here, each Sister City is represented by the aeronautical map for its airport, overlaid with the image of the city flower.

Blue Deer

Inspired by american folk art, quilting and storytelling, Clare Rojas creates dreamlike images executed in tightly drawn, crystiline shapes. Rojas intends to bring a sense of warmth and comfort to the viewer, and she often changes the exhibition space to better fit the feeling of her work. Here she transforms the gate room wall into space more reminescent of home. Blue Deer is based on a children's book Rojas wrote and illustrated, Blue Deer and Red Fox.

This work combines two images: a bird that symbolizes natural flight and a geometric grid that symbolizes the technological advances that made human flight possible. Implicit in the work is the potential for conflict between the natural world and technology.

Sanctuary/Sanctuario 2000

This painting is a family portrait of the Bay Area, a place rich with many different cultures. Just as arrival at SFO is the beginning of a new life for many immigrants, so it is refuge to many shore birds that flock annually to surrounding wetlands. The mural is painted in traditional "fresco buono," an ancient painting technique that mixes pigment directly into wet plaster.

KEITH SONNIER

American, born in 1941

Ceiling Flood

This artwork fully integrates the art lighting with the architectural lighting in the sterile corridor. The central fixture down the spine of the ceiling shines white task lighting down along the walkway, while yellow fluorescents flood the ceiling with yellow light. The cross beams along the corridor carry red and blue neon and argon lights to create a progression of light as travellers move through the space.

Neon, argon, and fluorescent light, 1,000 foot corridor, light fixtures every 50 feet.

SU-CHEN HUNG

American, born in Taiwan in 1949

Welcome 2000

Arriving international passengers waiting to have their passports checked encounter eleven rectangular columns with cast glass panels mounted on each side. While the cast glass on the front has a smooth finish, the back is cast into a serrated shape. Behind the serrated cast glass is a matching acrylic panel featuring vinyl letter text that says "Welcome" in different languages. The serrated layers create an optical illusion that the words disappear as the viewer walks by.
